FROM THE PRESIDENT As cooler weather arrives in Denver, Denver Environmental Health and Denver Fire Department would like to remind residents about Denver's open burning ban, which restricts the use of any solid fuel, including fire-logs, coal, wood, and the use of portable fire pits and chimeneas.

While local garden and home improvement stores often carry fire pits and chimeneas, these units emit significant pollutants, including particulate matter and dioxin, and can be even more harmful to those in the immediate vicinity through the direct inhalation of toxins.

Children are especially vulnerable, as their respiratory systems are still developing and they breathe more air and air pollution per pound of body weight than adults.

Wood burning also contributes to the brown cloud, particulates, carbon monoxide and additional hazardous air pollutants.

Denver's open burning ordinance is intended to protect safety, air quality and quality of life in Denver, as smoke is a significant public nuisance to neighbors.

Open burn ordinance violations can result in up to a \$2,000 fine.

RESOURCE. Denver has a website / Virtual Neighborhood (online) that keeps you in touch with what's going on in your neighborhood. Access to it is: **pocketgov.org/police.**

1. **LOG IN OR SIGN UP** to connect with a police officer in your neighborhood, to get crime alerts, safety tips and much more.
2. **FOLLOW** as many Denver addresses as you want to get news that matters to you and your family.
3. **READ POSTS** from your police officers and find out about events happening in your area.
4. **COMMENT AND RECEIVE UPDATES** to discuss happenings in your neighborhood with a police officer.

FYI: The Denver Police Department is conducting an auto theft reduction program where owners of some of the most commonly stolen vehicles in your area are eligible to receive an *electronic auto theft prevention device* for **FREE!** If you currently own one of the following vehicles, please call Denver Police Community Resource Officer Garduño at **720-913-0276** or Community Resource Officer Aranda at **720-913-0277**.

- **Honda Civic or Accord** 2004 or older
- **Jeep Cherokee or Liberty** 2004 or older
- **Ford Super Duty Truck (F150/250/350)** 2004 or older
- **Dodge Caravan** 2004 or older
- **Subaru**, any model older than 2008

Your Police Department has a limited number of these electronic devices to be installed without cost. Please call Officer Garduño at the number listed above with questions and to learn more about the free electronic device and program. Please leave a message if your call is not answered immediately.
