FROM THE PRESIDENT **ILLEGAL FIREWORKS.** There is a growing problem of fireworks being set off in the neighborhood around the 4th of July holiday and beyond. The use and possession of all fireworks is prohibited within Denver city limits. Violating these rules can result in a fine of up to \$999 and/or up to one year in jail.

The HOA board received several complaints last year about noise as well as fireworks hitting vehicles and landing in yards. This is both dangerous and discourteous; please think twice before lighting any fireworks in the neighborhood.

We also strongly encourage calling the fireworks hotline if you see any illegal activity. The board has also notified the district police of the growing problem and they are aware of our desire to curb this growing problem in our area.

FROM THE VICE PRESIDENT: Just a reminder to be mindful of being a good neighbor and recognizing that if you are outside late in the evening, others may be sleeping with their windows open and may hear your music or conversations if they are not at a respectable level.

In addition smoke from an outdoor fire pit can enter your neighbors open windows as well. Here is what the City of Denver says about outdoor burning. Please abide or politely let your neighbor know if you are getting smoke from their outdoor fire pits. You can call 311 to make a complaint if your neighbor continues to burn unlawfully. Open burning of wood (or any products other than propane, natural gas, or charcoal briquettes) is outlawed in Denver without permits from the Denver Department of Environmental Health and the Fire Prevention and Investigation Division. (Please note that home barbeques using propane, natural gas or charcoal briquettes, are exempt.)

If you would like to pursue open burning, you must obtain permits from two different agencies (special requirements for each agency will be listed on the permit itself):

Open burning permits are rarely issued to individuals, and permits are never issued for chimineas. If you do obtain permits for open burning in a qualifying outdoor fireplace for a special event, the permits from both agencies indicating their approval must be posted on site and a variety of requirements must be met.

Denver Chalk Art Festival

Date: Sat-Sun, June 2-3, 2018
Address: Larimer Square, Downtown Denver
About: Watch over 200 artists spend the weekend painting the sidewalks with chalk.

Colorado Shakespeare Festival

Date: Mixed days, June 8-August 12, 2018
Where: Boulder
About: 61st season showcasing Shakespeare's wonderful plays. It's held on varying days throughout the week on the CU campus. Other activities highlight this six day extravaganza.

Colorado Renaissance Festival

Date: Sat-Sun, June 16-17, 23-24, 30, July 1, 7-8, 14-15, 21-22, 28-29, August 4-5, 2018
Address: 650 W Perry Park Ave, Larkspur (between Denver & CO Springs on I-25)
About: On its 42nd season, the Renaissance Festival is held over 8 weekends in June, July, and August with medieval events for all ages. It's held 10am until 6:30pm each day, rain or shine. Parking is free, no pets.

Scandinavian Midsummer Festival

Stills In The Hills

Castle Rock WineFest

Evergreen Summerfest
