Councilman's Office Report (Kevin Flynn):

- The Amendment for the sidewalk fee passed. The fee will be \$150/yr per parcel. The first bills will go out in January and will be billed bi-annually. Parcels with sidewalks above 230' will be charged an additional \$3.50 per linear foot.
- Approximately 250 people attended the Far Southwest Meeting kicked off in September.
- There are two surveys on-line to be taken by Nov 4th; one for land-use opportunities and the other is for mobility and quality of life opportunities. The surveys are found at Denvergov.org/farsouthwestplan. Kevin Flynn encouraged us to share the link with friends and neighbors.
 - The city reduced the amount spent on the homeless and immigrant budget. Few immigrants are coming to Denver now and more than ½ of them didn't stay in Denver.
 - Harvey Park Grill. Kevin Flynn will meet with the owner this week.
 - Bear Creek Bridge – CDOT completed the rehab project of the bridge.
 - Weeds along Sheridan, under I-285. It appears CDOT is responsible for cleaning up these weeds.
 - The migrant work program is city initiated where 600 people can sign-up.
 - The 2025 Budget will include planting all flower beds in the parks!
 - The City budget includes 168 new police recruits. This still doesn't increase Denver police numbers because of retirements and other departures.
 - The Denver Film Festival will feature a movie called "The Order". The movie is based on the book "The Silent Brother", written by our very own Denver City Council member Kevin Flynn.

Gwen will look to see if we can find some artificial plants. Some on the board will look as well. Heather has a landscaper she just used and will send the name to Gwen.

- Membership –
 - Ed Griffin is selling their house. John was asked for Financial Statement, By-laws/covenants, minutes and newsletters from website but John is having trouble getting them. Roger is going to help John.
 - John reported 190 members paid their 2024 dues so far.
 - Long-term resident, Norbert Brady, passed away.
 - John is working on updating the directory.

- Parks –
 - Christie followed up on weeds in the landscaped area on Lehigh. They have been out to weed.
 - Bird Bath. City said that the valve may be broken so no more watering for this season.
 - Dog bags need to be refilled.
 - Christie ordered reusable stickers to use on the sign. They were used for the kickball Summer Bash. Can use again for the October social event.
 - Roger entered a ticket with Excel Energy to request the park light in the southeast corner of the cul-de-sac to be replaced. City street lights are maintenance in performed by Excel Energy.

- Safety – Not in attendance.
 - No update on the Neighborhood Watch meeting.

- Social –
 - Holiday party will be Thursday, Dec 5th:
 - Food/drinks: Hors d'oeuvres and hot chocolate. The HOA cannot provide spiked cider but Courtney or another resident can.
